What a power-packed last three months! These are great days to be alive, and we can only praise God for the wonderful things He is doing in and around us. The Joshua Foundation keeps growing, as God keeps working on us on the mission field.

From the last Report

Our Mission Administrator, Paul Scouller returned from Dubai having found and bought an outstanding Fuso Truck for the Foundation. Soon this will be plying the roads between Arusha and Lake Victoria as the first of our new business schemes gets underway.

Our search for more land continues across the river from our 17-acre base, although we're hoping to have this clinched within the next month. This will provide us the extra acreage we need for an airstrip, a model school, agricultural facilities, and the Joshua University (now being registered before further progress can be made).

The drilling rig and lorry being donated from Perth, Western Australia are now ready, and should be sailing our way in the next few weeks. Please pray with us for the on-field teams and their support which will need to be trained and released for this to become effective in presenting "Living Water" to the peoples of Tanzania.

Who's been doing what?

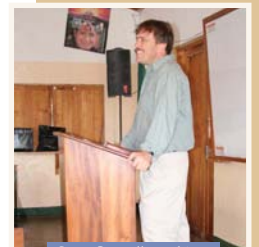
Our first module of the new 8-module series (each four months long) is now two-thirds of the way through. As always, it's been a life-transforming event as leaders and mentors have encountered Christ in a new way. Alan, Benson Moshi, and Peter Russell from the U.S. have taken most of the training load. Owen and Lois Wagener (College deans), return in November from a busy few months in New Zealand to cover the remaining sectors of the course.

Graduation '06* occurred on 29th September, and was another highlight. Many received certificates and diplomas, while eight leaders were capped after completing their 15,000 word thesis and obtaining a Bachelors of Theology degree.

The Colleges' campus is now being expanded with the terracing of our 4-acre mid-section block, thanks to a donation from the U.K. (Visitors continue to prove that for many, "seeing


challenging mindsets - reaching children

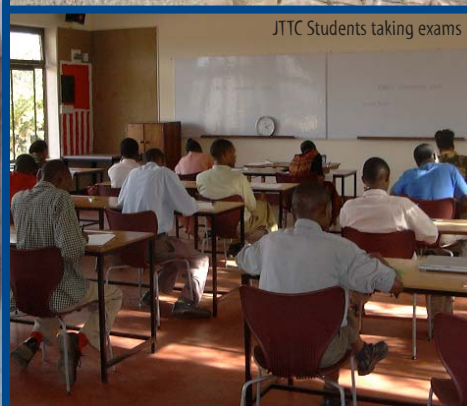


Paul and Sally Carstensen joined the team in June of this year. Here’s what Paul’s been involved in over the last few months as Missions Manager. He writes:

We have recently started excavation work on our mid-section development which will eventually see a new auditorium and kitchen/dining facilities built as well as accommodation for additional students. We are continuing to seek land near our base for further developments such as the model school and university, please pray for God’s favour. The building of the secondary school at Magugu is well under way and we are fortunate to have Josh, a kiwi sparky, with us for two months. He will be wiring the classrooms shortly.

We are also in need of a carpet layer and plumber, so if that’s you and you’d like to help out here, please email us.”

We need them to catch the vision for this community and to develop a true missionary heart for Magugu.

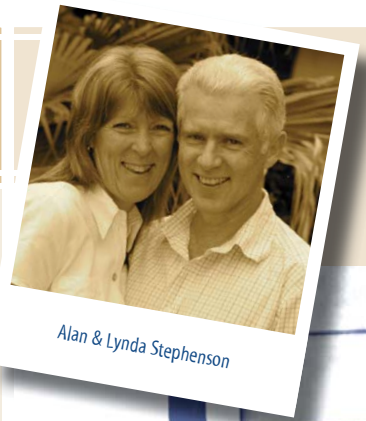
