praise points...for:

- **Directors' travels:** Lynda and I returned to Africa just before Christmas. The last month of our travels concentrated on Western Australia, Malaysia and Singapore, a first for us. Significant doors are opening for which we praise God.
- **Team and Base Developments:** During our absence the team has gone from strength to strength, and developments to the Leaders' and Teachers' Colleges' campus, and our schools continue. Praise Jesus for health and safety!
- **New land purchases:** God's emphasis last year to us was "Crossing Rivers". We've now commenced some strategic new land purchases across the river due to the generosity and foresight of a NZ church!
- **New Team members:** Josh and Renee Moose have not yet arrived due to new permit regulations here, but we now have confirmation of the completion of formalities from Dar es Salaam. We hope to see them soon!
- **Trucking Business!** Modifications to our Fuso truck have now been completed! A great driver has been found and regular haulages will start next week.
- **International Interest:** We rejoice as increasing numbers of Christians are applying for short and long term missions.

prayer points...for:

- **The Mooses:** For their safe, prompt arrival, full of vigour and readiness for all that God has for them!
- **Truck Business:** This will be the first of many new ventures for generating Africa-derived funds for mission. Intercede with us as we search out God's plans for other businesses which don't distract from the primary purpose of mission.
- **Next Leadership College Module:** This starts 5th February and continues for 4 months. The theme is "Victory of Faith", emphasising the wonderful, true victory we have in Christ on a daily basis. With some 35 leaders, pray for a great time.
- **Leaders' Sponsorships:** Our need of regular sponsorships continues. Pray that Christians will become strategic in their thinking and giving, following Biblical injunctions. Malachi 4:6

states, "Turn the heart of the fathers (leaders) to the children" in order for God to heal the land. It's only as a new "breed" of leader is raised up that we can expect "fruit that remains"!

- **Mentors:** Teachers' and Leaders' Colleges' mentors are always needing your prayers, especially those who travel from overseas to make input. Pray for dynamic impartation.
- **Land Purchases:** Plans for more land include a model Christ-centred school, an airstrip, and other ministries. Pray that God goes before us as we seek to glorify Him.

More time will be added, but in February and March we'll be based in Dar es Salaam. Joshua Primary School exam results are out and most of the news is good. Our Std 4 students all earned themselves either A or B – great results! Our Std 7 students all passed but 3 – grades still coming. Could have been worse, but it gives us a goal for 2007!!!

Reports are that Joshua Secondary School has a long line up of applicants for 2007. I travel to Magugu this week to make sure things are in order there and to help teachers prepare for the opening of Joshua Primary School. The opening of JSS has been delayed until March 5th, after the teachers Diploma exams.

We are still waiting for the results of our JTTC certificate exams. This month we will interview and select students for this year's JTTC course. Allan and Sue Dow are making definite plans to arrive in Arusha mid-April in time for the opening of JTTC.

- **The Dows** progress towards joining us here in April.

prayer points...for:

- **A good start to our JPS school year**, and especially for

- **Joanna** who is in NZ until late February, that her furlough will be productive and a rich time.
- **JTTC diploma students** who sit their exams in February.

college deans

owen & lois wagener

2006 saw us away from the College for about half the year. We spent longer in New Zealand than intended due to Lois needing to return to NZ again for an operation - and Owen took the opportunity to have a hernia repaired. Owen returned in November to help finalise the ministry for the module and Lois followed in December after treatment in Sydney.

Lois arrived back while Owen was in Uganda ministering into churches and taking seminars with three JLMC pastors located in south-eastern Uganda.

In the 17 days Owen spent in Uganda, he ministered in 37 sessions in 11 locations. The seminars were attended by leaders from various church groups in the different rural areas – with some 75 pastors plus many leaders attending. Even though evangelism was not the purpose of the trip it was great to see at least 10 conversions from several of the churches visited.

The time 'down-under' this year was well utilised – great opportunity to catch-up with family, churches and friends. Owen also ministered into two Auckland Bible Colleges and we attended several great conferences that continue to fuel our seeking of God for a greater manifestation of His kingdom in how we live.

The focus is now on 2007 - the new JLMC module, the ongoing work with the pastors, the furtherance of the women's ministry and applying solutions to the devastated ecology in East Africa.

praise points...for:

- **Wonderful provision in medical treatment.** God went before in all the timing and arrangements, the procedures, healing and provision. We so appreciate all of the prayer and practical support we received.
- **The ministry through the conferences in NZ.** It is such a blessing to have such God-appointed input that further equips to minister effectively to others.
- **Ugandan Ministry.** For effective ministry to further the work of those trained at JLMC. God's protection from accident and disease, His answers in almost impassable roads and anointing on the Word and ministry was continually evident.

prayer points...for:

- **The leaders for the next module.** The minimal course fees remain an immense hurdle for the leaders attending the module. The enemy attacks through all manner of ways to frustrate their opportunity to receive transformation.
- **Wisdom in work beyond the base.** There is continual demand for us to visit the churches of the pastors who have trained here and those leaders involved in the women's conferences. We need the most effective approach to consolidate, and multiply the ministry from this base.
- **Visiting ministry.** The input from experienced overseas ministry is a vital part of JLMC. Pray that the God-ordained

person can be released to us at the right time to minister.
