Our latest education initiative has just been launched. We are opening En Gedi Preschool!! One of our very first Joshua Teachers Training College (JTTC) graduates, Celina, is joining TJF staff to be the teacher of this school. Our students include Talia Carstensen, one of our TJF team kids, and 6 of our En Gedi staff kids. What a great opportunity to pilot our model school ideas. Teachers will also come from village preschools to be mentored here.

JTTC is off to a fantastic start with an eager intake of students. Several conversions, many recommitments and lots of prayer – wonderful fruit of having our own on-campus chaplain, Patrick for the college. Allan and Sue are doing a great job of helping to carry the work load – Sue in JTTC lecturing and Allan in helping to set up a Christian School Association and principals training course.

Results of our Diploma students exams came out and all passed with flying colours, putting our college into a top position in Arusha. Joshua Primary School Std 7 students have also taken top positions in their regional mock exams.

Joshua Secondary School students have settled in well and we have seen several Muslim kids born again. We are still looking for staff with missionary hearts to work there.

- **Great diploma results!!**
- **The seed of our model school** being planted as we open En Gedi Preschool this week.
- **A wonderful bunch of students for JTTC** – all eager to learn God's principles for education.

- **Students being saved** at Joshua schools.

The second 'foundational' module has finished and participants are now back into their ministries, attempting to make up the time away from their families before the next one begins in August. Several completed their coursework and now each one needs to complete their thesis to graduate. We now look to the next module with its focus on the Books of the Bible and the need for a mission emphasis in every church. All participants will attend the Christian Leader's Network conference - a great way to launch the new module!

praise points...for:

- **New teacher trainees** that arrived during this module, who integrated much better than previous intakes.
- **Visiting ministry** who have made a great contribution - especially for those on their first module.
- **Several donations** received in time for four men who were not going to be able to continue with their studies - how they and we rejoiced at the provision.
- **The impact** that the ministry this module has made - so many have testified to the blessing received.

prayer points...for:

- **The participants** - the module break is a pressured time as they attempt to fit six months of work on the 'home front' into only two months. They also face the challenge of raising fees for their next module.
- **New participants** to replace those who finished in May. We so much want those ordained of God - key ones in their communities - so our input is multiplied to make the vital changes needed in East Africa.
- **Provision** of facilities and ministry to provide English teaching and to operate a continuous cycle of modules 1 and 2 parallel to the more advanced modules.
- **Owen and Paul Prentis** are in Uganda from 10th July - 2nd August to run seminars and minister into local churches - hosted by three Ugandan Pastors, trained at En Gedi. We expect 500 - 1000 pastors to attend.
