En Gedi Preschool has now completed 2 months of great teaching and learning. From initial tears, fears and general disarray the little student body is now a happy thriving learning community! Celina reports:

- >> the Tz kids are speaking and understanding a lot of English and Talia's Swahili is improving.
- >> all the kids now know who God is (good progress!!) and are asking lots of questions about Him.
- >> literacy and numeracy skills are being developed and kids are settling into routines.

Joshua Teachers Training College students are in for their second term – they too are making good progress with their English as well as their teaching skills. Spiritual progress is also very encouraging.

We have a plan in place to improve teaching at Joshua schools in Magugu – more regular visits and input underway. Meanwhile JSS teachers in particular are up against some strong spiritual forces. Many students have been set free but the battle still rages.
