**Land Extensions:** 14 acres have now been purchased across the river for our upcoming “Community Centre”, model school, and agricultural college! This now gives us a total of 31 acres for our ministries, enabling us to reach out more effectively across Africa.

**Planes and Pilots:** Scott Brallier (North Carolina), has spent a wonderful, Spirit-guided 3 weeks in Tanzania in preparation for his family’s arrival in late 2008 as part of the team, and as director of the aviation side of Joshua.

**Student sponsorships:** please see the Colleges’ reports below for more details. These vital ministries of training leaders and teachers are a primary area of concern and need.

**International Travellers** from around the world need your prayers for their vital ministry contributions to our colleges and schools.

### EDUCATION DIRECTOR

Joshua Teachers Training College students are just completing their second term with a 2 week teaching practice at a number of schools. Quality of teaching varies at this stage from surprisingly good to mmmm.....room for improvement!! Overall, not bad for this stage of their training.

Joshua Schools in Magugu are into their fourth and final term of the year. We continue to make fortnightly visits with special input into improving maths teaching. The results are pleasing. October 1-5 our whole education department are going for a 'blitz' week, when we will do maths testing across the primary school and English testing in secondary. We are also sad to report the deaths of 2 of our students there within a week of each other. A secondary student died of malaria complications. Esther, a Std. 5 girl, died strong in her faith after battling Aids for a term. This type of thing is a real challenge in a school. A witchcraft circle has recently been uncovered in the school. The major participants have repented and been delivered and born again!! The fight is on for Magugu!

En Gedi Preschool continues to flourish with our teacher Celina reporting great growth and development in her small charges. Celina regularly has teachers in from other schools to observe and learn in her classroom.

Allan Dow and I have now completed writing up the philosophy documents for the Tanzanian Association of Christian Schools. and will present them at the next meeting in October.

**The container from the UK** has been packed and is on its way. Included is the bridge which we hope to erect in January 08.

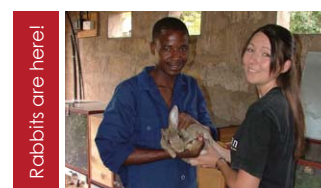
# PRAYER

**Better funding/sponsorship for the leaders being trained** – and - not just for their course fees. Three needs came to light last week alone – a pastor's son at boarding school being hospitalised because of no funds for a machine to monitor his diabetic condition, another's son going deaf because of an untreated ear problem that had given him pain for years – and a wife hospitalised from continuous vomiting – there is no free emergency care in these impoverished African nations – it is cash or you are left to die!

**The continued protection and blessing upon the ministry of the visitors to the College** - their contribution into the lives of the leaders is so valued by them.
