- >> **A strong and capable team** from diverse backgrounds and walks of life.
- >> **Health and strength** as we come to our year-end and reach into the next with even greater determination and excitement.
- >> **Many African leaders and teachers** who are carrying the "Christmas Message" – "peace to men of good will everywhere" – in their everyday lives, as a result of the training they've received in Joshua Colleges. Africa is on the rise!
- >> **Safety and development in Tanzania!** God's protection is evidently on this country, blessing it so it can be a blessing by:
 - o The televised preaching of the Gospel in parliament by parliamentarians themselves, calling the nation back to "the God of the Bible" in "Wilberforce" fashion.

 - o Increased sponsorships to be made available from overseas for Leadership and Teacher training, schooling for boys and girls, and for the training and salaries of national staff.

All Joshua School exams are over and the school closed for Christmas. We open again on Jan 5th with a new head teacher in the primary school. Our long-serving head, Teddy, is getting married on Dec 6th, and she has been preparing Goodbert, our Year 7 teacher, to take over her position. Teddy will be moving to live in Arusha and will teach in our En Gedi preschool. Next year we are planning to open our second preschool class at En Gedi, giving us a morning and an afternoon class.

Joshua Teachers Training College (JTTC) students are just completing their last term at En Gedi with exams coming up. Next year they will be out in schools. As a college staff we have some time before our next course starts and we are looking into developing a new model of teacher training, based on increased mentoring time in schools.

There will be a lot of work to do for the Tanzania Christian Schools Association (TaCSA) next year, as we set up procedures, and plan for our first conferences in June – one in Dar es Salaam and one in Arusha.

Joanna, Meagan (a part-time JTTC lecturer who works for another mission) and myself have just completed a week long seminar at a nearby large Christian school. Our teachings on Christian Education were enthusiastically received and we have been invited to make ongoing input there.
