The **Tanzanian Christian School Association** (TaCSA) was launched publicly in the first week of August with two back to back three day conferences; the first one in Dar es Salaam and the second in Arusha. More than 90 people attended each conference and there was much interest expressed towards further conferences and development of the association. Lynda currently holds the position of Chairperson on the executive committee in this organisation and the conferences were organised by TJF.

The visit of **Dr Bev Norsworthy** of Bethlehem Tertiary Institute to be the key-note speaker at these conferences has also allowed us some precious time talking about the future of JTTC and the structure of our courses. >>> AGRICULTURE | renee moose

Even with the scarce rains we had, the people who had implemented the **Farming God's Way (FGW)** principles to their fields and lives have seen abundant harvests, those who did not have seen very meagre harvests. One of the men who just harvested after using FGW said that this was the largest harvest he had ever had! During a time of drought he has been blessed abundantly for his wholehearted effort and his willingness to change!

In July I held a **FGW seminar** for 20 community leaders who had requested help on how they could improve the crop yields for each of their communities. These leaders have experienced a severely hard planting season due to the drought. It was amazing during the seminar to see how God changed their old patterns of thinking and deposited peace and hope into their hearts. The leader of their group said that they will immediately begin implementing the FGW principles in their lives and farms in order to improve the inheritance of their children!

PRAISE for ...

- >> **Restoration:** The hope, peace and lifted burdens physically visible in those that God has touched through FGW
- >> **Revelation:** Those who have seen first hand the promises of God! II Chronicles 7:14
- >> **Opportunities:** Every seminar given opens doors to more areas. The Good Word is spreading!
- >> **Translation:** A new Swahili version of the manual has been completed and I was able to use it for the last seminar
- >> **Tools:** Pastors that attended the seminar said that they never understood God had any involvement in farming but now they understand He cares about the whole man! They said they now have a holistic tool to help their congregations!

PRAYER for ...

- >> **Assistance:** We need more people to help in this field. There are so many in need of this program and right now I am the only FGW rep in the area.
- >> **Communication:** That the news of FGW would spread further out to other communities in Tanzania. Also, that the leaders who have received training would be able to clearly communicate all that they have learned to the villages for which they are responsible.
